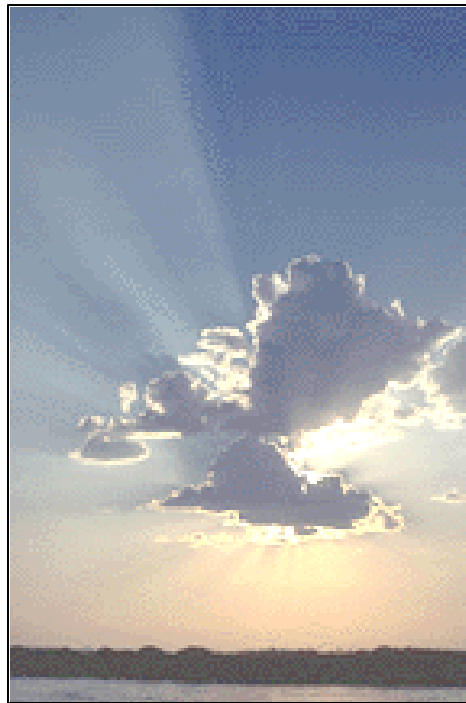

In my 30 years of working in evangelism and church growth, *I have never been more excited about the power and potential of a strategy for outreach than I am about what is described in this document!*

I would like to introduce you to a **12-month process that will significantly increase your church's evangelistic effectiveness and growth**. It is a unique opportunity for 100 congregations here in southern California, called *THE NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP*. Here are some of the benefits you can expect:

- √ More of your members involved in evangelistic outreach—*and really enjoying it!*
- √ More creative outreach ministries in your church that are attracting new people.
- √ More men, women, and children coming to faith and involvement in your church.

These are results you can expect—regardless of your church size or denomination.

Beginning in September (2004)—and continuing for 12 months—Church Growth, Inc. will be working closely with 100 area churches to guide them in the application of an evangelistic strategy called “Ministry-based Outreach.”

Ministry-based Outreach is a process wherein your church will identify specific “people groups” in your community around whom you focus intentional outreach ministry. Such groups might be people who share a *common concern* (health, finances, family, etc.) ... a *common interest* (fishing, reading, gardening, etc.) ... *common age* (adolescents, seniors, GenX, etc.) ... *common gender* (widowers, young women, fathers, etc.) ... or some other characteristic that identifies a unique group of people in your community. And *you decide the groups to focus upon* ...based on the interests and passions of your own people!

As a church in the *NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP* you will be guided through each step of the process with an integration of **seminars...personal coaching...video training...and leadership support groups**. The process is based on years of research on how and why people come to faith and churches grow. In the *NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP* you will be in a group of like-minded churches that are learning and applying a process of outreach that you will use for years to come.

The following pages describe Ministry-based Outreach and the *NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP* in more detail. I hope you will take a few moments to familiarize yourself with them.

If you believe your church can be more effective at reaching people in your community with the good news of Jesus Christ, the *NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP* is **an opportunity that could be strategic** in your church's history. Use the registration form on the last page to reserve your place as one of the 100 churches in this special project.

The Challenge	<p>A large number of churches in southern California are not adding new members through “conversion growth.” A recent observation by the Barna Research Group provides insight into why outreach efforts seem more difficult than ever:</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;"><i>An analysis of people’s time and resource management indicates that the nation is splintering into increasingly smaller, sharply defined, and diverse segments. The Response	<p>The <i>NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP</i> is a 12-month mentoring relationship with 20 churches in 5 regional clusters throughout southern California. Each participating church will be guided through an individualized application of the proven process of “Ministry-based Outreach.” The <i>NEW HOPE</i> projects begin in the fall, 2004.</p>
The Expected Results	<p>Churches participating in the <i>NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP</i> are expected to experience:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) an increase in the number of members involved in evangelistic outreach; 2) an increase in the number of outreach ministries sponsored by the church; 3) an increase in the number of men, women, and children coming to Christian faith and involvement in the church.
The Model	<p>In the <i>NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP</i> participating churches will be guided through the application of the four-step process of “Ministry-based Outreach,” which is to:</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;"><u>Step #1:</u> Identify and research two “people groups” in the community for an evangelistic outreach focus.</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;"><u>Step #2:</u> Plan an appropriate “Entry Event” for each group.</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;"><u>Step #3:</u> Provide an appropriate “Entry Path” for each group.</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;"><u>Step #4:</u> Identify felt needs, initiate acts of Christian love, and cultivate meaningful relationships with the people in each group.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>(See p. 4 & 5 for a more detailed discussion of Ministry-based Outreach.)</i></p>
The Process	<p>Churches involved the 12-month <i>NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP</i> will participate in:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A one-day seminar—<i>How to Reach Unchurched Families in Your Community</i>. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The seminar occurs early in the project and presents the model, the process, and the steps of Ministry-based Outreach. ○ Each church receives a video of the seminar for further training. • Individual consultation with a <i>NEW HOPE</i> coach to realize the successful application of Ministry-based Outreach in the church. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ A <i>NEW HOPE</i> coach is in regular contact with each church via phone and e-mail. **The
Process**

During the 12 months of the *NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP* you and other participating churches progress through the following sequence:

PHASE ONE—Preparation

1. You will receive guidelines to recruit 3-5 persons willing to serve on the *NEW HOPE* Executive Team. These are people who will oversee the implementation of your Ministry-based Outreach initiatives in the coming year.
2. An orientation meeting is held for all *NEW HOPE* Executive Team members in the project. A timeline of events and goals for the ensuing 12 months will be discussed, and the scope and sequence of the project will be explained.
3. The Team’s first task will be to distribute a “Congregational Profile” survey [provided] in your church. The surveys are tabulated, graphed, and analyzed in order to identify those in the church who share common concerns, upon which a new outreach ministry might potentially be built.

PHASE TWO—Introduction

1. Your *NEW HOPE* Executive Team and key staff attend the 1-day seminar, *How to Reach Unchurched Families in Your Community*, held in a convenient location.
2. In the seminar you will be introduced to the 4-step model for Ministry-based Outreach, you will learn why and how the process works, and you will consider possible groups around whom you might focus.

**The
Process***continued*PHASE THREE—Implementation

1. Your *NEW HOPE* Executive Team identifies two “people groups” that your church will focus upon in the coming year. Identifying these people groups comes through identifying church members who have an interest in seeing the church begin such a ministry. Clues as to member interests and potential new ministries will be found in the computer analysis of your church’s Congregational Profile.
2. Your *NEW HOPE* Executive Team oversees the enlistment of two separate Ministry Planning Teams. These two groups are each composed of 2-5 members who wish to help the church begin that particular new ministry.
3. Your two Ministry Planning Teams, with help from the *NEW HOPE* coach and your Executive Team, implement Steps 1 - 4 of Ministry-based Outreach (see p. 4 & 5), which occurs over the remainder of the project...and beyond.

PHASE FOUR—Support

1. Members of your *NEW HOPE* Executive Team attend bi-monthly leadership meetings, together with the Executive Teams from other participating churches. These meetings provide opportunity to report experiences, share ideas, review additional information, provide encouragement and accountability, and continue planning ministry initiatives. The meetings last approximately 2 1/2 hours and are facilitated by the *NEW HOPE* coach.
2. Each cluster of 20 churches has a coach from the *NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP* office. In addition to leading the bi-monthly Executive Team meetings, your coach will be in regular contact with your church to provide individual suggestions, encouragement, and ideas. Your *NEW HOPE* coach will also help you with ideas and sources for researching your selected people groups.
3. Your church will receive a regular newsletter that includes ideas for outreach, resources related to various target groups, question & answers, and additional information helpful to your Executive Team.
4. You have unrestricted access to your *NEW HOPE* coach throughout the year for help in addressing specific questions you may have about applying the Ministry-based Outreach model in your church.
5. During the 12-month project, you will also be encouraged (and helped) to contact other churches around the country that have a ministry to similar people groups, in order to make your own initiatives most effective.

PHASE FIVE—Expansion (optional)

1. Your commitment to the *NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP* is for 12-months. At the end of that time you will examine the progress your church has made in applying the process of Ministry-based Outreach. You will have the option of concluding the relationship, or continuing for one additional year. At the beginning of the second year another 1-day conference is given for participating churches entitled *How to Assimilate Newcomers Into Your Church*. This conference provides practical ideas for welcoming and involving newcomers in the life and fellowship of your church.
2. During the second year you will apply the same Ministry-based Outreach steps, but enlarge their application to additional target groups. Your *NEW HOPE* coach continues to be a resource for you, as in the first year. Bi-monthly meetings for the Executive Team also continue in the second year.

The Cost	<p>Participation fee for the <i>NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP</i> is \$95 per month for twelve months. If the second option year is selected, the participation fee is \$90 per month for the additional twelve months.</p> <p><u>Denominational Discounts:</u> If you are in a denominational family and register through your regional office, all churches receive the following discounts: 5-9 churches deduct \$5/month; 10-14 churches deduct \$10/month; 15-19 churches deduct \$15/month; 20+ churches deduct \$20/month. (Discounts are calculated on the <i>total</i> number of registrations through a regional office, even though churches may be participating in different regional <i>NEW HOPE</i> projects.)</p> <p><u>Scholarships:</u> If you wish to participate in the <i>NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP</i>, but your church is severely limited in financial resources, you may apply for a partial scholarship of the monthly dues from the McGavran Trust Scholarship Fund. (Contact the <i>NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP</i> office for application information.)</p>
Money Back Guarantee	<p>You, and all other churches in the <i>NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP</i>, receive a full “money-back guarantee” upon registration. The guarantee provides for a 100% refund of all fees paid if, at the conclusion of the project, you are not satisfied with the return on your investment. This guarantee assumes you have made a good-faith effort to understand and apply the principles of Ministry-based Outreach as presented in the <i>NEW HOPE</i> project.</p> <p>You may also opt out of the remaining 11 months in either year if, at the conclusion of the initial one-day seminar, you determine that the <i>NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP</i> is not how you wish to engage in evangelistic outreach.</p>
The Benefit	<p>As a result of participating in the <i>NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP</i> project your church will...</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. be introduced to an effective process of evangelism and outreach; 2. be guided through the application this process in your situation; 3. find support through networking with like-minded church leaders; 4. be able to continue and to expand your outreach to new people groups in your community beyond the conclusion of the project. <p>Through identifying and focusing evangelistic outreach on specific groups of people in your community you will...</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. involve more of your members in evangelistic outreach; 2. focus the Gospel’s message on needs and concerns of specific people in your community; 3. nurture new relationships between church members and non-members in the community based on their common interests; 4. begin new classes and groups in your church that serve as “entry paths” for people from your community to establish relationships with people in the church; 5. ultimately increase the number of people who come to new Christian faith and membership in your church. as a result of #1 - 5, see new excitement, enthusiasm, and expectancy grow throughout the congregation because of what Christ is doing through His body—your church.

<p>The Four Steps of “Ministry-based Outreach”</p>	<p>Your church, and other churches participating in the <i>NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP</i> project, will learn about and then apply a process called Ministry-based Outreach. The process is broken into four steps that become your blueprint for outreach initiatives during and beyond the <i>NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP</i>. These steps are briefly described below...</p>
<p>STEP #1: Identify & Define Your Target People Groups</p>	<p>The first step you will take is to identify two unchurched “people groups” that will be your church’s focus throughout the project. This begins, not by looking at your community, but by looking at your own congregation. What are the strengths God has given to your church through the interests, passions, experiences, and concerns of the people <i>already in your fellowship</i>? A key to effective Ministry-based Outreach is to identify passions in the church and <i>channel</i> them...not to identify passions and then try to change them.</p> <p>As a <i>NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP</i> church you will be guided in how to identify interests and concerns among your members. A two-page “Congregational Profile” Survey is given to each youth and adult in your church, in which they respond to questions on marital status, family status, special interests, special concerns, life experiences, and other topics that will help you identify potential “hot spots” for new ministry opportunities.</p> <p>Selecting a target “people group” is dependent on identifying a group of 2 – 5 members who want to see the church begin such an outreach ministry, and are willing to help make it happen in the coming year. Most likely these will be members who can closely relate to the target group. These “Ministry Planning Teams” (one for each group) will oversee a unique research process called a “focus group,” which will help them learn more about the attitudes, fears, dreams, and needs of these unchurched people. Your <i>NEW HOPE</i> coach will help you in conducting your first focus group as a means of gathering important information about the unchurched people for whom you will be developing a new ministry.</p>
<p>STEP #2: Identify, Plan, and Promote an Entry Event</p>	<p>Many people in your proposed target group will have no regular church involvement. The best way to establish an initial contact is through an “Entry Event”—a high-visibility experience, sponsored by your church, that will be of interest to the individuals (or families) in your defined group.</p> <p>Your Ministry Planning Teams will be provided with guidelines on how to determine an appropriate event, and how to plan and promote it successfully. The excitement of organizing such an activity (be it a conference, tournament, trip, seminar, rally, or something else) is contagious. Others in your church will watch, and even want to participate in making this special event a success. Ideas for publicity, funding, and programs are provided.</p>

<p>STEP #3: Identify, Plan, and Promote an <i>Entry Path</i></p>	<p>An “Entry Path” is a program, group, or activity sponsored by the church in which a non-member can become involved <i>on a regular basis</i>. It is a place where non-members develop meaningful relationships with members in your church based on shared interests or concerns. It is these relationships that are the “bridges of God” over which most people cross in coming to faith and fellowship in Christ’s Church.</p> <p>You will be introduced to possible groups and classes [entry paths] appropriate for your target groups. You will receive help from your <i>NEW HOPE</i> coach on how to find curriculum and identify group leaders. You will plan the appropriate number of meetings such groups should have, and learn how to nurture meaningful relationships among participants in these groups.</p>
<p>STEP #4: Develop and Implement a <i>Follow-Up</i> System</p>	<p>As Ministry-based Outreach grows in your church, you will see more and more non-members becoming involved in groups and classes [entry paths]. But the <i>NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP</i> provides for an important last step to see these people move from group membership to Christian discipleship. Here you will receive a helpful “Caring System” that provides a practical way to track your relationship with each of these prospective new members. You will review your recent contacts with each person/family and identify next steps that will facilitate their “pilgrim’s progress” toward faith and church involvement. Step #4 is the process of systematically monitoring the spiritual development of the people God has brought into your sphere of influence.</p>
<p>Dates and Locations for the <i>NEW HOPE PROJECT</i></p>	<p>The <i>NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP</i> project will begin in the fall, 2004. As noted on page 1, the project runs for 12 months, with an optional second year (12 months) beginning in the fall, 2005.</p> <p>A <i>NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP</i> project will be hosted in five different locations in southern California: 1) Orange County, 2) San Fernando Valley, 3) San Gabriel Valley, 4) Riverside/San Bernardino, and 5) San Diego. Each cluster of 20 churches will have its own one-day seminar and Executive Team meetings in a mutually agreeable and convenient location.</p>
<p>Coordinating Agency for the <i>NEW HOPE PROJECT</i></p>	<p>The <i>NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP</i> project is coordinated by Church Growth, Inc. in Monrovia, California (www.ChurchGrowth.net). CGI has been dedicated to facilitating church health and growth for over 30 years. Dr. Charles Arn, president, is a nationally known authority in the field. CGI has trained over 41,000 clergy, 154,000 lay leaders, and 1,200 military chaplains.</p>
<p>Questions & Answers</p>	<p>Q: <i>Tell me again, exactly what is “Ministry-based Outreach?”</i></p> <p>A: It’s simply a process that builds bridges from your members to unchurched people in your community...based on common interests, concerns, and needs. It presents Christian faith in the context of these relationships and shows how the gospel is, indeed, relevant to the world of the unchurched. It is not a process that creates sweaty palms...tight collars...or stomach butterflies—which is the reaction of many laity when they hear the word “evangelism.” Actually, it’s great fun for those members who get involved, because they’re doing what they already like to do...and being part of the disciple-making mandate in the process. While Ministry-based Outreach is rooted in solid research, the motivation is, as the Apostle Paul said, to become all things to all people in order to reach some.</p>

	<p>Q: <i>Why is Ministry-based Outreach so effective?</i></p> <p>A: Several reasons: 1) over the long-term (and even in the early stages) Ministry-based Outreach <i>involves many more members</i> in the church than are likely now involved—and in their personal area of interest; 2) evangelism begins with the <i>unchurched peoples’ agenda</i>—the way Jesus began with the woman at the well; 3) it then <i>nurtures relationships</i> between members and non-members, which is the key to how the church grows; 4) it approaches evangelism as a <i>process</i> that is ongoing, not an event that is carried out and then finished; 5) Ministry-based Outreach <i>contextualizes</i> the Gospel to each person, based on their unique issues and concerns, rather than trying to use one “canned” approach for everyone.</p>
<p>Questions & Answers <i>continued</i></p>	<p>Q: <i>Why can’t we do “Ministry-based Outreach” on our own?</i></p> <p>A: You can. Many churches that are reaching people today are doing just that. In fact, the <i>NEW HOPE</i> process is based on research of growing churches that are effectively practicing Ministry-based Outreach. If you already understand and are applying this powerful approach to evangelistic outreach, keep doing so. But if you’d like some help getting started, then the <i>NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP</i> project will be of assistance—you won’t spend nearly as much time “reinventing the wheel.” One of our goals in the <i>NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP</i> is, upon your “graduation,” to see your church practicing and expanding this process of target group evangelism on your own...for years to come.</p> <p>Q: <i>There’s not a very strong passion in our church for evangelism. I’m not sure we could get everyone involved.</i></p> <p>A: One of the great things about Ministry-based Outreach is that you don’t need to get everyone involved. All you need to begin a new outreach ministry is several people (in some churches it’s been only one!) who have a concern or interest in <i>something</i>; it doesn’t even have to be evangelism! A passion for a certain issue...an experience with a life-event or situation...even just a hobby can be the nucleus for a new outreach ministry. Enthusiasm among your members for beginning a new ministry will grow from their <i>already existing</i> interests. Remember, Ministry-based Outreach does not try to <i>change</i> members’ interests, it <i>channels</i> their interests.</p> <p>Q: <i>We’re a rather small church. Does this idea that we need only a few people with a shared interest to begin a new outreach ministry mean that we don’t have to be a big church to make it work?</i></p> <p>A: Exactly. What <i>is</i> important is a desire among leaders to see their church be more intentional and effective in sharing God’s love—and the love of God’s people—with the unchurched in their community.</p> <p>Q: <i>A full refund guarantee?! How can you be so sure the process works?</i></p> <p>A: We’re not so naive as to think that the <i>NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP</i> will work wonders for every church in every situation. We recognize there are other “growth-restricting obstacles” that sometimes keep a church from reaching its greatest potential. So, at the end of 12-months, if you conclude that your church’s growth is stunted by more than just the absence of an effective evangelism strategy, we have no problem refunding your participation dues. However, we have seen Ministry-based Outreach be a surprisingly effective spark to ignite new lay involvement in outreach and evangelism in many non-growing churches. So, providing a money-back guarantee is something we’re willing to do if it helps more churches effectively act on Christ’s command to “...go and make disciples.” To be in a church where members begin to see friends and relatives coming to faith, lives being changed, people joining their church...well, that’s a benefit worth our risk of occasionally returning a church’s registration fees. We’d hope that you would consider such an eternal benefit to be worth the risk you would be taking in time, effort, and priority to reach those people.</p>

Questions & Answers

continued

Q: *We're pretty hard up for money, but we do need to start reaching out. Is there any way we can cut some costs and still be involved?*

A: If you are part of a denominational family, you can save from \$60 to \$240 when registering with other churches from your region (see page 3.) If there are 20 churches in your region that would like to participate, your denomination can sponsor its own *NEW HOPE* project and arrange individual financing for participating churches.

Another possibility... If your church averages less than 50 in worship, and is unable to afford the monthly cost, contact the *NEW HOPE* office and request a Donald McGavran Scholarship application. Dr. McGavran taught at Fuller Theological Seminary for many years, and was a pioneer in the study of evangelism and church growth. Upon his passing he left some financial assets to further the cause of effective evangelism. There are a limited number of scholarships available. If your church qualifies, you will receive a partial credit on your monthly fee.

On the topic of money, incidentally, it has been found that most growing churches invest around 10% of their total budget on outreach and evangelism in their own community (*The Growth Ratio Book*, Win Arn, p. 18). Perhaps not coincidentally this is the same amount individual Christians are called upon to tithe. "Where you money is...there is your heart, also" may be a description of a church's priorities, as well as an individual's. And certainly new giving units added to the church (to say nothing of souls added to kingdom) will more than repay your investment in reaching them.

Q: *Southern California covers a lot of territory. How far will we have to drive to get to the seminar and bi-monthly Executive Team meetings?*

A: Probably no longer than 25-30 minutes. There will be five *NEW HOPE* projects of 20 churches each throughout southern California (see page 5). In addition to proximity and convenience, the size of each project is limited so that we can stay in contact with participating churches. Providing personal quality time with each church is a priority.



SPECIAL NOTE: Because the *NEW HOPE PARTNERSHIP* is limited to 20 churches per region, if you feel there is a good chance your church will be interested, you would do well to reserve your place in the project early. This is easily done with a phone call or letter, accompanied by a \$95 deposit (applicable to the total fee). The down payment is fully refundable up to 60 days prior to the beginning of the project.

Q: *Who are you guys, anyway? Who is "Church Growth, Inc."?*

A: CGI was founded in 1973 by Dr. Win Arn for the purpose of researching and disseminating insights on how churches can effectively reach people and make disciples.
